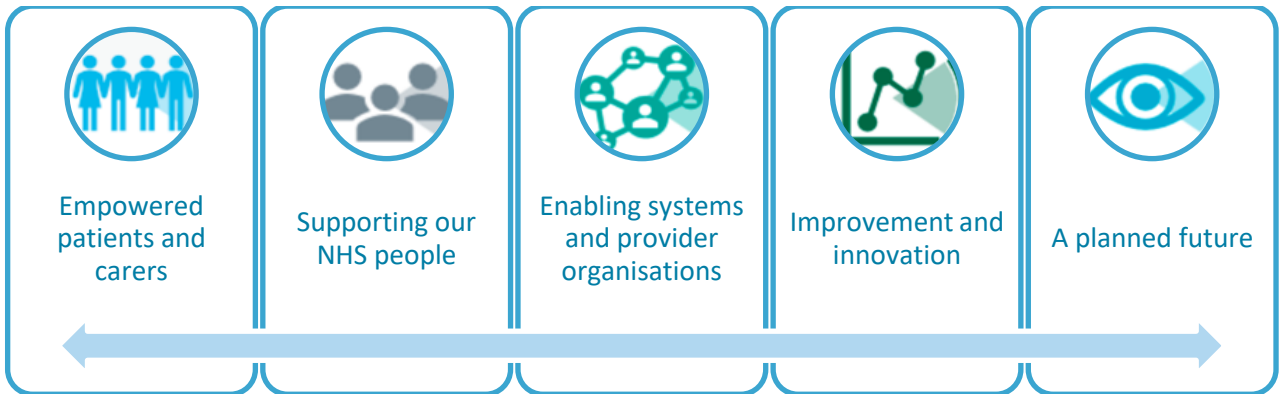

National Priorities for Digital Community Health Services:

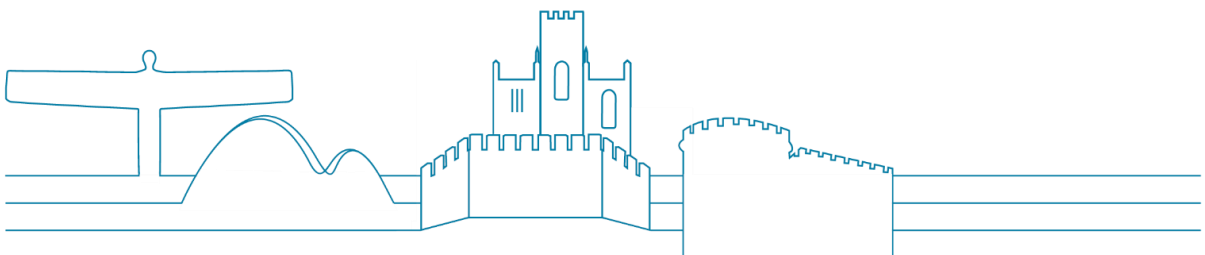

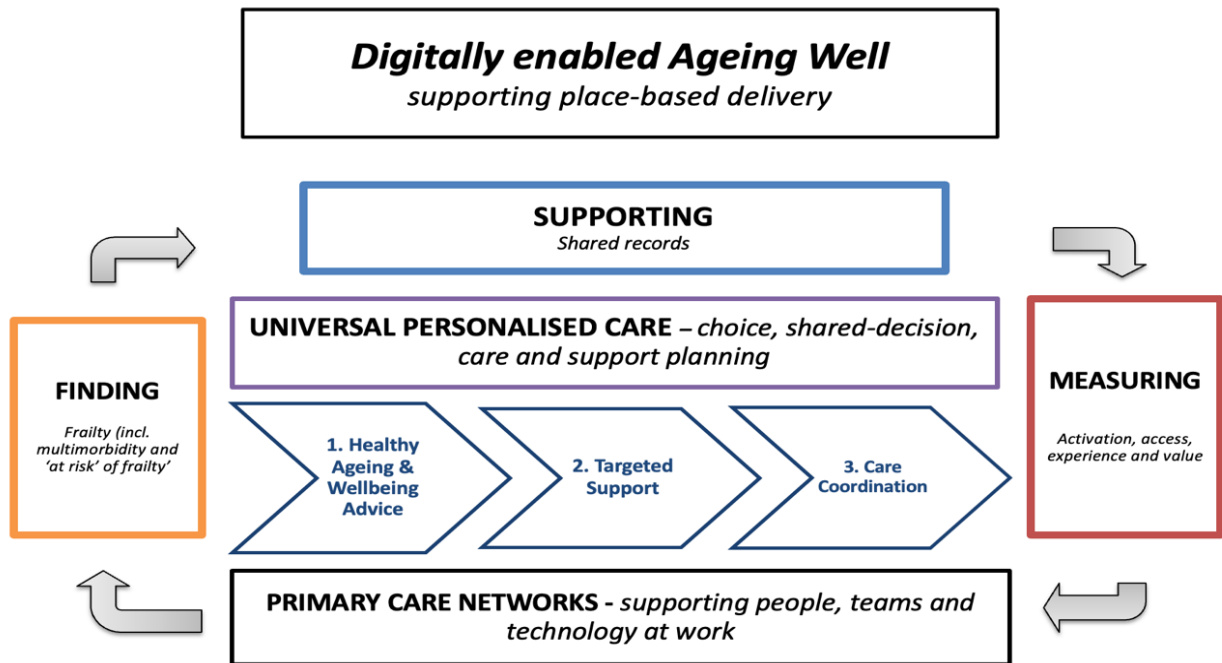
